

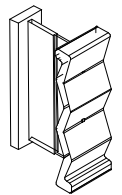
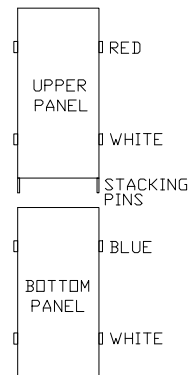
TIPS AND TRICKS

UNPACKING YOUR BOOTH:

- Take a special note of how your booth is packed and in which case each component is located.
- Locate setup instructions, read carefully before you start assembling your booth.
- Unpack all the components, if you are able to place them on racks, place them with the white clips towards the bottom. Make bottom (blue and white clip) components more accessible.
- Notice all components that have seam connectors; place them together in one place so they are accessible when needed.
- Save all packing materials for repacking, note the keys to doors are located inside the set up instruction folder.

ASSEMBLING YOUR BOOTH:

- Using the footprint on the set up instructions, determine a starting point.
- Start with bottom (blue and white clipped components).
- White clip is always towards the floor.
- Pay special attention to seam connecting components, always placing them in where indicated (with an arrow) in the set up instructions.
- Before setting up level 2, place any counter tops into place. If they are in two pieces, reach through the door and buckle them together.

- If there are any bridges, or panels that span across an area, measure them at level 1 before setting up level 2, (by using the components themselves).
- Make sure the stacking pins fall into the bottom panels, when setting up upper levels. (Tapping on the panels will achieve this if the pins stick).
- **DO NOT** use abrasives or other bottled cleaners that contain ammonia, they can dull the clear finish. Use an Acrylic or Plastic Cleaner and a soft cotton cloth.

DISASSEMBLING YOUR BOOTH:

- Carefully take down the upper levels, do not leave one or several panels in a straight line alone, because risk of them toppling over and damaging product.
- If there are any components that velcro on your booth, using a credit card to remove them makes it easier. Do this by sliding the credit card in between the hoop and loop velcro.

PACKING YOUR BOOTH:

- Repack corners, headers, and counter tops in the provided boxes or bubble wrap. Be sure to protect surfaces that are vulnerable to scratching with foam sheets.
- Pack flat items at the bottom of a case or tub. Smaller components in bottom of red cases.
- Pack heavier items, such as counter tops and doors, underneath fragile and curved items.

- Always place a foam sheet next to any laminate surface that may rub against another surface other than fabric while in transit.
- Whenever there is anything attached to a panel such as a door lock, door pull, or grommet, which stands out from the profile of the panel, place a corrugated slip-sheet between this panel and another adjacent panel to prevent denting of panels.
- When packing a curved panel that is over two feet wide, provide support underneath the panel to prevent it from sagging, (corner boxes do the trick).

These tips and tricks are only a few recommendations with your ModularOne panel display. Each booth is unique; therefore, the booth you actually purchased may have special requirements. Working with your dealer will help assure that your ModularOne products will last for a long time.
